#### SCIENCE BLAST:

The Fourth classes participated in the ESB Science Blast in the RDS. Each class thought



of a question to investigate, and the pupils voted on three questions and chose to investigate 'How do hand hygiene products compare at killing germs." The pupils carried out an investigation which initially involved everyone washing their hands and using hand sanitiser, so everyone had clean hands when starting the investigation. After carrying out our normal school activities for two hours, four different hand hygiene products were used. The hands were swabbed, and agar plates were used to grow bacteria. We observed the bacteria grow on the agar plates over a period of time. On the 1<sup>st</sup> of March, 30 pupils across the classes went to the RDS to exhibit our investigation and to get the opportunity to see other school's experiments. The adjudicator gave us positive feedback and we were presented with a plague for our hard work and commitment to the investigation. This was a wonderful learning experience for all.
