

Communication with the

Office/Reception

Due to the high volume of work and administration in the office we would ask parents not to phone with messages to be passed on etc, as we are unable to do this.



In the event that you miss a telephone call from the school we would ask you to please check for any messages left before returning the call.

As we experience a very large volume of call there is an answering machine service in operation. We would ask that you leave a brief message, contact details and time of message, and we will endeavour to call you back as soon as possible.

We would also ask for patience when calling to the front door as Reception staff may be dealing with a telephone guery or have someone with them in the office. Many thanks!

Internet Use/Safety

We cannot emphasise enough the importance of parental supervision of children's activity on the internet as many websites can be used for cyber bullying,

paedophilia, etc. Please warn children not to give names, addressed or personal details over the Internet under any circumstance. In our school we have a filter system which blocks access to unsuitable websites. Safety of Pupils



The safety of our pupils is of paramount importance. We, therefore, ask that all (children and parents) avail of the service provide by Maria, our Lollipop Lady, and cross only with her at the pedestrian crossing. We would ask that you stress that mes-

sage to your older children who may be crossing on their own.

We would **also** ask that the older pupils do not congregate on the footpath outside the front of the school but wait in Eden Park until their bell sounds.

And we would ask parents not to stop cars in the middle of the road to allow children get out of the car as this is very unsafe and contributes to traffic congestion.

Healthy Eating Policy

We have a Healthy Eating Policy in the School.

As staff we are committed to teaching children about nutrition and importance of a good balanced diet through curriculum, and an awareness programme

We gather and process your child's personal data

for the purposes of administering the education of your child. To facilitate this, your child's data is input into the school's Management Information System, Aladdin. Aladdin is a secure software service application which is



owned and run by Cloudware Ltd (T/A Aladdin Schools), from where the data in **ONLY** processed for the above purpose.

Uniform

Pupils of The Harold school are expected to come into school in full uniform. Skorts, pumps, ugg boots and sneakers are not allowed. **Runners may be worn with** school tracksuits on PE days only.

On PE and GAA days pupils may wear their school



tracksuits (plain navy tracksuit bottom- no logos or stripes) and runners. During warm weather plain navy shorts (as specified in the school's uniform policy) are permitted






We are all looking forward to our big annual fundraiser on **27th October** which promises
