

Green School: Patrick Earls from Swift Conservation Ireland has been in contact with the school and we are going to provide some of the external walls of our school for installation of swift nesting boxes. The swift is an endangered bird which migrates to Ireland's towns to breed each year. The children should be able to spot these birds from the playground once the boxes are installed in April. There will also be some talks given by Swift Conservation Ireland introducing them to these endangered birds.

Green School Committee

The Green Schools committee have been holding regular meetings and have conducted



a global awareness survey which is a starting point in our steps towards our next green flag. A question from the survey asked if the children recognised the Fair Trade Logo and we will be working hard to increase awareness among the school community of this great initiative. The children on the committee also designed posters for their classrooms to ensure that the milk cartons are being recycled correctly and there will be a school wide drive to encourage bringing reusable water bottles to school.



There has been lots happening in the garden and polytunnel over the last couple of months and it is looking beautiful with all the spring flowers in full bloom! Many of the

lovely daffodils and tulips we see were planted by Senior Infants last October and this week they planted summer flowering bulbs. The garlic planted by 6th class is growing well and this week they sowed sunflowers seeds and made bird feeders. 4th class are learning about propa-

gation and took willow cuttings last week. They have already taken home their salvia plants which they grew from cuttings. The broad

Next week Junior Infants will be planting potatoes and 5th class will be sowing carrots, spinach and peas.
